






BRES Budget Priorities

- ➤ The PTA worked with Mrs. West on submitting BRES <u>FY22 budget priorities</u> from BRES to MCCPTA. This included supporting MCPS funding to:
 - Address Bussing Issues & COVID-19 safety (KN95 masks, tests & improving air quality).
 - Maintain/increase our staffing levels (counselors, world language, paraeducators, etc.)
- ➤ The RM cluster coordinator included as part of RM testimony during 1/18 BOE Budget Hearing
- NAACP Parent Council RM Cluster testimony was also given by NAACP RM cluster rep
- ❖ MCCPTA Board of Directors sent a <u>letter to the BOE</u> 1/20 on COVID-19 response and planning

Advocacy Committee: What Have We Learned?

- The rapid upward trajectory of BRES student enrollment is a pressing issue in need of advocacy
- Since opening in 2018, BRES has outstripped projections with a December 2021 enrollment of 768 students in a school built for 740 students (12% higher than anticipated for 2023-2024)
- Distribution of students within the cluster is uneven with two schools at 80% capacity and with declining enrollment
- Jumps in enrollment are anticipated when students return to in-person learning or enroll back in MCPS, and due to new, large residential developments within BRES boundaries



Advocacy Committee: What Have We Done?

- Gathered supporting evidence of overcrowding trend
- Come to consensus on advocacy goals for PTA consideration
- Identified strategies and tactics to achieve advocacy goals
- Identified target audiences for advocacy
- Began crafting advocacy messaging



Advocacy Committee: What Is Next?

- Continue gathering data to inform the development of strategies to advocate for reducing BRES class sizes while maintaining staff talent, limiting disruptions to students, and ensuring a safe, inclusive, and equitable learning environment
- Complete advocacy workplan with proposed goals, strategies, target audiences, and messaging
- Circulate advocacy workplan among PTA members for feedback
- Submit advocacy plan reflecting PTA members' input to the PTA Board for consideration
- Implement advocacy plan while serving as a forum to address additional concerns of PTA members





SUMMER LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE





Payment Plans

Register March 10 - April 15

- Divide the amount due into three payments
 - 1st payment is at the time of registration
 - 2nd May 1st
 - 3rd June 1st

Register April 16 - May 15

- Divide the amount due into two payments
 - 1st payment is at the time of registration
 - 2nd June 1st



Withdrawals & Refunds

Full refunds can be granted for any reason if received two-weeks prior to the start of the program.

If received within two weeks to the start of the camp session, 50% of the fee can be refunded.

No refunds or credits can be issued after the start of the program except for health-related withdrawals.


